# FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of the prophet Amos 8:4-7.

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**

Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor.

#### **SECOND READING:**

A reading from the first letter of Paul to Timothy 2:1-8.

#### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:**

Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty.

#### **GOSPEL: LUKE 16:1-13**

Jesus said to his disciples, 'There was a rich man and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, "What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I going to do?



Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes."

'Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" One hundred measures of wheat" was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond and write eighty."

'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than they are the children of light.'

'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity.'

Dear Parishioners,

Please make sure if you are a normal Saturday night Mass goer that you don't turn up on AFL Grand Final night for the usual 6pm Mass – as that is the only night Mass will be celebrated at 7pm . WARNING • WARNING •

While I celebrate the Masses at Spotswood and Newport this weekend, please make welcome their Parish Priest, Fr Samuel to celebrate the Masses here as we have a change of pulpits once again with our nearest neighbouring parish. Fr Samuel comes originally from Manipur, a State in India only 300 kilometres south of some of the biggest mountains in the world. Much of the State consists of hilly terrain. The two major religions are Hinduism and Christianity. Manipur is India's 'gateway to the east'. Burma (Myanmar) also shares a border with Manipur.

# **SCRIPTURE READINGS:**

- A) FIRST READING: Amos was the first of the canonical prophets. He was a herdsman called by God to prophecy to Israel. Amos knew that the country's wealth was built on social injustice and that the people had no real regard for their religion. Accordingly, in this reading he attacks the use of false measures and the practice of selling the sweepings of wheat for wheat itself actions directed against the poor.
- B) SECOND READING: In the reading prayers for all people are enjoined, especially those in high places of authority, and for the pagans around them.
- **C) GOSPEL:** The parable of the unjust steward is one of the more difficult passages in Scripture to work out. I am still trying to make head or tail of it!

FAITH FORMATION: Our Parish Council has expressed the importance of it and faith formation was also brought up at our annual parish meeting on June 1<sup>st</sup> this year. For greater formation in the faith to take place it often means going a few kilometres out of our comfort zones. One of the better places for this formation is at the Catholic Theological College at 278 Victoria Parade East Melbourne – not far from the Fitzroy Gardens also in East Melbourne. Their courses and opportunities are many and varied. I have put them up on the back board of the Church. For instance, there are 13 sessions in October at only \$25 per any session you choose ranging varying from 'An Introduction to Al and Transhumanism ....for Christians' to 'Catechesis in a Secular Age 'with Dr Paul Sharkey. The latter being former head of the Catholic Education Office in South Australia and who frequents our Masses in Williamstown occasionally as he now lives in the Newport area.

POPE INFORMS NEW BISHOPS TO PROMPTLY ADDRESS ABUSE CLAIMS: Following on from Safeguarding Sunday last Sunday I noticed that Pope Leo told 192 new bishops from around the world that they must respond promptly to allegations of inappropriate or abusive behaviour by priests. 'These cannot be put in a drawer- they must be addressed with a sense of mercy and true justice towards both the victims and the accused'. The Pope spent the previous Thursday morning with the new prelates, including five from Australia, who were in Rome for the Vatican's annual formation courses for new bishops.

**NEW SAINTS OF CATHOLIC CHURCH:** I must admit having been blindsided by the announcement and canonisation of two new Saints for the Catholic Church on September 7<sup>th</sup> by Pope Leo. I have since looked them up! Carlo Acutis is the first British born Italian who was the first millennial to be made a Catholic saint. He was born to Italian parents in 1991, in London and died in Monza Italy, 2006, of leukemia at the age of 15. "Carlo, for his part, encountered Jesus in his family, Andrea and Antonia – who are here today with his two siblings, Francesca and Michele." Pope Leo stated. Carlo Acutis also encountered Jesus at the Jesuit- run school he attended and "above all in the sacraments celebrated in the parish community...He grew up naturally integrating prayer, sport, study and charity into his days as a child and young man."

Pier Giorgio Frassati was born 1901, in Turin Italy and died there in 1925 of polio at the age of 24. "Pier Giorgio's life is a beacon of lay spirituality...For him, faith was not a private devotion, but it was driven by the power of the Gospel and his membership in ecclesial associations...He was also generously committed to society, contributed to political life and devoted himself ardently to the service of the poor." Pope Leo stated. He also stated, "even when illness struck them and cut short their young lives, not even this stopped them nor prevented them from loving, offering themselves to God, blessing him and praying to him for themselves and for everyone."
